SOA Invasive Species Prevention Efforts

- Renewed our contract with the Adirondack Watershed Institute run by Paul Smith's College to ensure 7 day a week coverage at the Boat Wash, the DEC Launch and the Village launch from Memorial Day to Labor Day.
- Arranged for another three weeks of harvesting of Variable Leaf Milfoil in Paradox Pay.
 - Switched from Invasive Dive Solutions to the Upper Saranac Foundation. Program overseen by the USF Lake Manager, Guy Middleton.

Invasive Species Harvesting Data

- All Variable Leaf Milfoil in Paradox Bay
- 2016 – **31.25 lbs** removed (2 days in June)
- 2017 - **25 lbs** removed (1 day in August)
- 2018 – **1,025 lbs** removed (4 days in August).
- 2019 - **1,675 lbs** removed (8 days –August – October)
- 2020 – **147.6 lbs** (12 days June and August)
- 2021 – **126.7 lbs** (12 days in June, August and September)
- 2022 YTD **18.75 lbs** (4 days in June, 8 more in August-Sept)

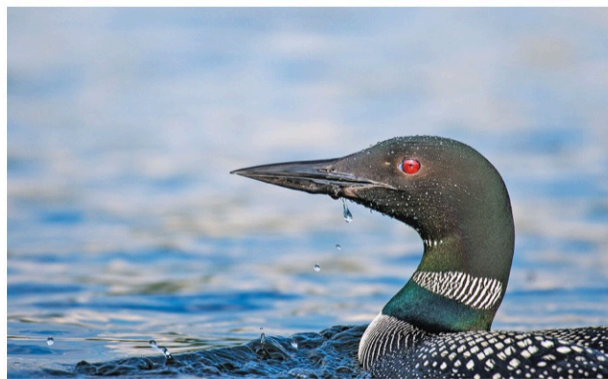

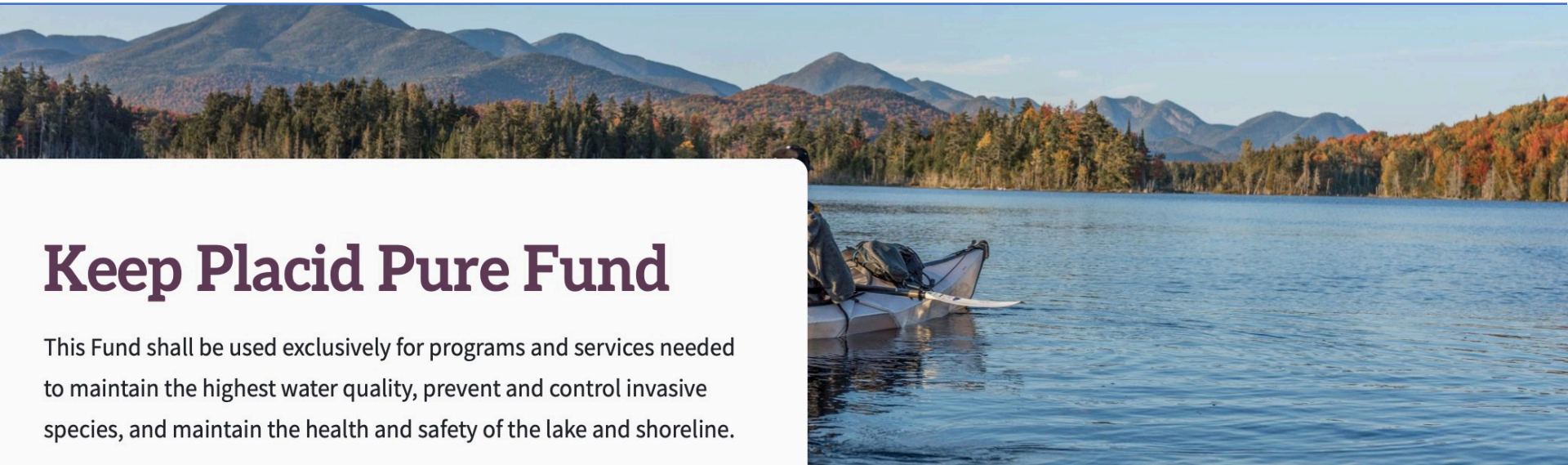

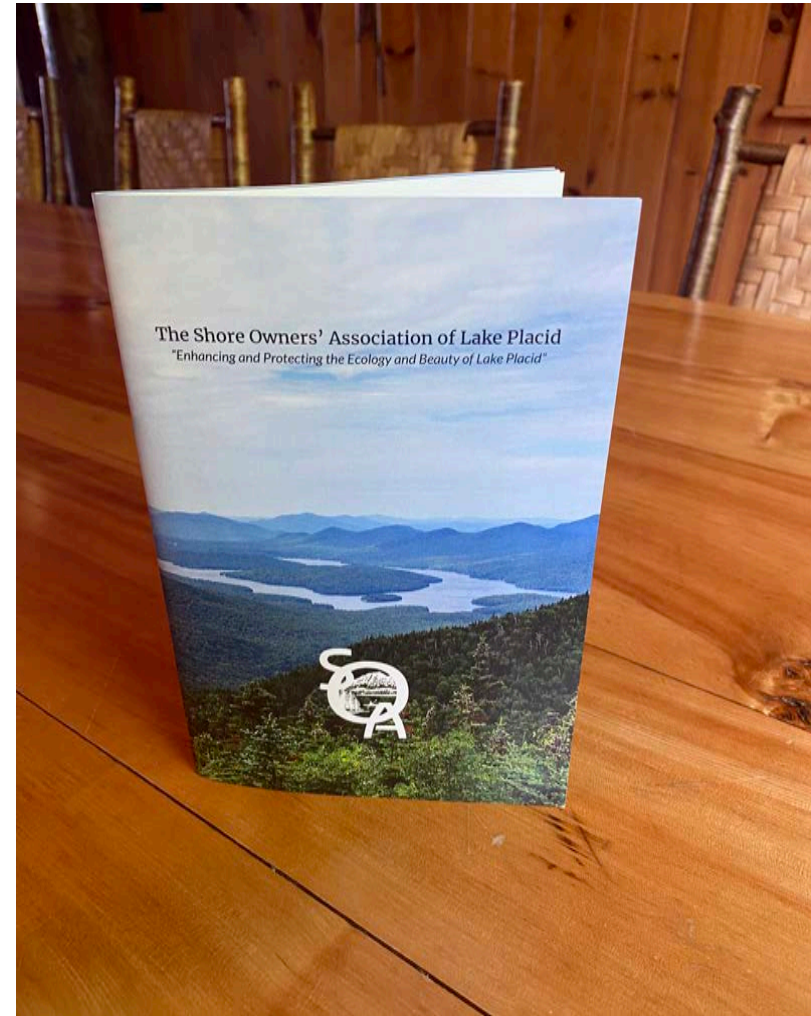
